LGIP v1.3 Interim Amendment

Introduction

This guide provides information to support the public consultation phase for the proposed interim amendment to the Local Government Infrastructure Plan (LGIP v1.3). The public consultation phase starts on Monday 13 November 2023 and ends on Friday 8 December 2023, inclusive. During this time information about the proposed changes to the LGIP is available for review from Logan City Council's website, and submissions supporting or objecting to these changes can be made to Council.

About the LGIP

The Local Government Infrastructure Plan (LGIP) is a long-term plan that shows the trunk infrastructure needed to serve the community and support growth across 6 infrastructure networks being: **water supply**, **sewerage** (wastewater), **stormwater**, **transport**, **parks and land for community facilities**. Queensland's planning legislation (*Planning Act 2016*) requires local governments to prepare an LGIP if they intend to seek contributions from developers towards the provision of trunk infrastructure. The



planned infrastructure shown in the LGIP is based on considerations such as the projected future urban development, the desired standards of service (DSS) and the capacity of existing infrastructure.

The LGIP helps Council prepare a long term financial plan and capital works program for the delivery of infrastructure. It also allows Council to condition a developer to deliver infrastructure made necessary by their development.

Logan City Council adopted its first LGIP in May 2017 as part of an amendment to the Logan Planning Scheme 2015. Council has since adopted two interim amendments (LGIP v1.1 and LGIP v1.2) and is now proposing a third (LGIP v1.3) based on updated planning assumptions. This update will help ensure we can provide the infrastructure needed to support the type and scale of future growth across the city.



Changes in LGIP v1.3

The changes proposed in LGIP v1.3 affect all 6 of the trunk networks and result in an increase in costs and updates to the planned schedules of work. Council is making the draft LGIP v1.3 available to the community and will review all feedback received. The table below highlights the key areas of change.

Planning assumptions	Updated and endorsed by Council in 2020. The planning assumptions indicate the type, scale, location and timing of future growth and development expected in Logan. This informs the demand for future infrastructure. For example, there are around 43,000 extra houses expected in Logan by 2036.
Horizon	The current LGIP uses a base date of 30 June 2014 and plans out to June 2026. LGIP v1.3 uses a base date of 30 June 2020 and a planning horizon extending to June 2036 .
Schedules of work	Updated to reflect updated planning assumptions and the costs to acquire land and deliver infrastructure. Some items in the schedules have been removed, some carried over, some changed and some added.
Desired Standard of Service	Update the desired standard of service for the water supply, sewerage and movement networks.
Costs	The total cost of the current LGIP is \$513 million. The total cost of LGIP v1.3 is \$1.27 billion . Council must ensure that the LGIP is affordable; a feasibility test has been completed.

Under the requirements of the Planning Act 2016, a properly made submission must:

- be made in writing to Council (email, hard-copy or online) and be signed **by each person** making the submission;
- be received by Council during the notification period (on or before the last day, being Friday 8 December 2023); and
- include:
 - the name (first and surname) and full residential or business (street) address of **all** submissionmakers;
 - o reasons for the submission (grounds, facts, circumstances relied on to support the grounds);
 - one postal or electronic address for service relating to the submission for all submissionmakers.
